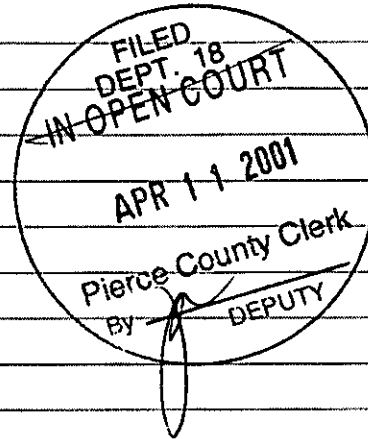

If the case has not been filed, but an initial pleading is served, the Case Schedule shall be served within five (5) court days of filing. See PCLR 1.

Compliance with the scheduling rules is mandatory and failure to comply shall result in sanctions appropriate to the violation.
